



Introduction

Kenyans overwhelmingly ushered in our current constitution on the promise of devolution which they felt result in increased grass root access to resources and political power. Indeed people's expectations of county governments continue to be extremely high.

While most county governments tend appreciate this fact and try to capitalise on low hanging fruits as soon as they kick off, others prefer to spend the nascent stages laying the ground work and planning elaborately for delivery. Irrespective of leadership styles may differ, what is critical is for people to feel the impact of devolution in their daily lives. County governments need to fully decipher the perceptions of their residents and develop strategies that are concomitant with their expectations.

It's against this back drop that Infotrak Research developed the CountyTrakTM Performance index to provide Citizens' Scorecard of their County governments against set key performance indicators.

The CountyTrak Methodology

"This Index is the first of its kind and magnitude in Kenya. It provides the county governments and other interested stakeholders with robust statistics by ward on the perception of county residents over county governments' performance of the devolved functions."

- Our current index was conducted between July— August 2023, covering all the 47 counties, 290 constituencies and 1450 wards with an overall sample of 36,200. Each county was treated as an individual universe and assigned a cluster sample which ranged between 600 and 2000 respondents guided by the population and number of wards in the respective counties. Within each county, sampling frames were designed using population proportionate to size guided by census data and catered for demographics such as age, gender etc. Data was collected through Computer Assisted Telephone Interviews (CATI) and analysed using SPSS.
- The CountyTrak tool consisted of twelve core functions with thirty three key performance indicators and five approval rating questions. The functions included: Agriculture, Health, Education, Roads & Transport, Energy, Water management, Environment & natural resources management, Trade & Tourism, County Planning & Development, Housing, Lands & settlement, Culture & Sports and Social Services. Also covered was Public Participation, Planning, and Management of County Resources.
- The final questionnaire was structured with using I-I0 Likert scale being applied on each indicator where I was very poor and I0 was excellent. The mean was computed for each Sub-Indicator of the Key Performance Indicators (KPI) to get the Index for that Specific KPI. The Overall County performance Index was then computed by taking the average of the KPIs.





The County Functions covered

Under the other key functions, we included the following:

- Making it difficult for people to access hard drugs (bhang, khat, illicit brews, etc.) and pornography? (i.e. licensing, enforcement, registration etc..)
- Ensuring county government services are available in your ward
- Preventing corruption (i.e. zero tolerance to corruption and taking action on alleged corruption cases)






Still on the same issue of development how would you compare the current county government and the last county government (2017-2022)?






Agriculture dominates the economy of Kenya, with 15 to 17 percent of Kenya's land being sufficient and fertile with adequate rainfall for farming. Due to Kenya's rich variety of landscapes, every county should be been able to identify a key crop to focus on. Kenya's breadbasket, Uasin Gishu, has capitalized on its topography and historical strengths to emerge as the top-performing County in Agriculture with 63%.

Other top performers like Trans Nzoia, Elgeyo Marakwet, Kericho, and Bungoma credit their achievements to modern farming practices, including using improved seeds, fertilizers, and mechanization. Extension services, farmer training, and innovative approaches like media-based agricultural education have also played pivotal roles in the successes of counties excelling in the sector.

Homa Bay, the most improved county in agriculture during the period 2020 to 2023, launched the Kigoto maize plant within the first 100 days of the new administration. They also invested in agricultural mechanization to address the challenges faced by farmers. Other counties that had significant improvement in the sector were Kitui, Kirinyaga, Nyandarua, and Kiambu.







Health is one of the most important devolved functions, accounting for almost 30% of county budgets. Whereas the National Government has retained health policy, technical assistance to counties, and management of national referral health facilities, County governments handle essential health service delivery through level 1 to 5 hospitals.

The top performing county in health is West-Pokot. Some of the efforts they have made in the sector include the construction of a new county hospital in Kapenguria, which provides specialized health services that were previously unavailable in the county. They have also constructed several new dispensaries and health centers across the county to provide essential healthcare services to underserved areas. Further, the county has boosted its establishment of healthcare workers and launched a number of health initiatives to improve the quality of life of its residents.

Other top-performing counties in health are Homa Bay, Tharaka Nithi, Turkana, and Kwale.

All counties that have improved in health function have done three main things: One, they have built or refurbished major health facilities; two, they have restored the provision of drug and essential supplies across the county; and three, they have boosted the number of health workers.

The most improved County, Homa Bay, embarked on a comprehensive refurbishment of the Homa Bay level 5 hospital, constructed new health facilities, and restored essential drug supply to facilities across the county. Another improved county, Mombasa, has constructed new facilities in Miritini and Likoni and also streamlined services across the county. Trans Nzoia has equally constructed a new county teaching and referral hospital with 350 bed capacity.



As a fundamental Human Right, most governments have tried to ensure education is inclusive from ECD to the tertiary level. While the National government still oversees the co-education function, County governments have specific responsibilities over early childhood education (ECDs) and Technical Vocational Educational and Training (TVETs). Budgetary allocations for the sector are generally used for infrastructural development like building classrooms and human resources, i.e., recruiting, training teaching staff, and supporting needy students through bursaries and scholarships and, most recently, the introduction of school-feeding programs. The top-ranked counties have tailored various programs to address the unique needs and challenges they have, contributing to their overall success.

West-Pokot, like many frontier counties, has historically lagged in education due to Its geographical location characterized by rugged terrain and limited road network. Moreover, insecurity manifested mainly through cattle rustling and inter-communal conflicts that have frequently led to disruption in the normal functioning of the schools. The traditional nomadic lifestyle in the county has also proven to be at odds with formal education, which requires consistent attendance. Impressively, the county has emerged as a top performer in the sector in 2023 at 63%. The county's investment in infrastructure, teacher recruitment and training, peace and security initiatives, nomadic education, school feeding programs, advocacy for girls' education, bursaries and scholarships, community engagement, and strategic partnership seems to be endearing to their residents.

Other top-performing counties in the sector, like Kericho, Elgeyo Marakwet, Murang'a, and Tharaka Nithi, have also invested in more or less the same areas, laying emphasis on the specific needs of their county residents. This is also the case for the most improved county, Trans Nzoia.





Efficient road and transport systems are crucial for enhancing connectivity, accessibility, trade, and overall economic growth and development. Citizens appreciate well-maintained wide road networks that permeate the most interior areas. They also value efficient public transportation and traffic management. The top performing County, Nyeri, has invested in upgrading a number of rural roads, making it easier to transport farm produce, routes constructing bypasses to ease and enhance its public transportation system, and significantly enhancing its bus parks. Other top-performing counties that seem to have invested commensurate to public expectation are Uasin Gishu, Elgeyo Marakwet, Kericho, and West Pokot.

It is important to note that the public seldom has adequate information to distinguish national from county roads. Hence, where significant efforts in road development may have been accrued through allocation by national governments, certain counties may benefit from public satisfaction in the sector without having invested significant resources. The most improved County, Trans Nzoia, indicated in its 2022-2023 plans to construct new bus parks in Kitale town and roads linking Trans Nzoia to neighboring counties to boost economic activity. Delivery of these plans could be attributed to the improved performance. The second most improved County, Homa Bay, has implemented "The Major Access Road Rehabilitation" program, which incorporates constructing one major road per ward. This is already improving accessibility in villages.






Renewable energy is key to the transition of a sustainable future for the world because it is clean and helps to reduce the reliance on fossil fuels and the adverse effects of climate change.

Under energy, Kenyan county governments are responsible for identifying the counties' renewable energy potential and plans to harness it. They are also expecting to invest in renewable energy infrastructure such as solar and wind power plans, biogas digestors, and microplates. County governments are also responsible for raising awareness of the benefits of renewable energy and encouraging residents and businesses to adopt renewable energy and sources.

The top County, Kirinyaga, has constructed a solar power plant in Kutus Town to provide clean, affordable energy to businesses and residents. They have also constructed a number of biogas digestors to provide clean cooking gas to farmers. The county government is also working to connect households and businesses to the grid and already has several homes connected. They have also provided solar lanterns and other off-grid energy solutions to residents in remote areas. Further, Kirinyaga has invested in training and capacity building on renewable energy technology.

Other top-performing counties are Nyeri, Embu, Kericho, Uasin Gishu, and Tharaka Nithi. The most improved Counties are Trans Nzoia, Taita-Taveta, Bomet, Nyandarua, and Baringo.









Trade is one of the most important devolved functions and is a key driver of economic growth through job creation, poverty reduction, and improvement of livelihood. Counties' responsibilities under trade encompass developing and regulating markets, issuing trade licenses, promoting fair trade practices, supporting cooperative societies, and promoting local tourism.

Five Counties tie in the first position as follows: Kwale, Kirinyaga, Uasin Gishu, Trans Nzoia, and West Pokot. Besides benefitting from international tourism, the Kwale County government has constructed new markets in Diani and other rural areas. It has also supported the development of a cashew nut processing plant and promoted ecotourism, especially in Shimba Hills, and cultural tourism through destinations like Kaya Kinondu sacred forest. Kirinyaga has constructed several markets, e.g., the one in Kutus Town. It has also worked towards promoting value addition in the dairy sector through the development of a milk processing plant. In tourism, the county has developed several ecotourism trails and promoted cultural tourism destinations like the Mwea Museum and Karumandi Cultural Centre. Uasin Gishu, Trans Nzoia, and West Pokot have supported the development of a number of markets for trade and tourism enterprises. The county governments have also actively sought foreign direct investment in various sectors. Uasin Gishu has also capitalized on sports tourism.

The most improved county is Homa Bay, which recently reported an increase in revenue collection from 100 million to 800 million Kenya shillings in 2022-2023 through digitized revenue collection. The county also facilitated the launch of Renegade Airlines and inaugurated the Roan Antelope half marathon aimed to market the Ruma National Park.

Other most improved counties are Trans Nzoia, Narok, Kiambu, and Nyeri.



In Kenya, the implementation of innovative housing, lands, and settlement programs has contributed to the success of various counties. These programs are aimed at providing affordable housing, proper land management, and sustainable settlement planning. Initiatives in this sector are supported through a tripartite arrangement, which includes the National, County Governments, and private sector.

Housing challenges remain a shared priority addressed through strategic partnerships with private developers, housing cooperatives, and community groups that incorporate initiatives such as low-cost building technologies, mortgage facilities, and infrastructure development, all aimed at providing comfortable homes to residents. With regard to land management, counties focus on efficient land use, urban planning, and formalizing land ownership through the provision of title deeds.

The two leading Counties in this sector are Nyeri and Tharaka Nithi. Both Counties have implemented customized programs to mitigate the challenges. Through its "Affordable Housing for All" program and Tharaka Nithi through its "Rural Housing and Settlement Enhancement" program have respectably incorporated strategic stakeholders to enhance affordable housing and improve land management issues.

The most improved county is Trans Nzoia. It is followed by Kirinyaga, Garissa, Kisii, and Kiambu, all of whom have initiated innovative programs in the area.





Other counties, including Kirinyaga, Embu, Kericho, Elgeyo Marakwet, Nakuru, Kisumu, and Murang'a, have equally embarked on initiatives aimed at expanding access to clean and safe water. These efforts involve drilling boreholes within solar-powered villages, constructing water storage tanks, and implementing improved water harvesting techniques that enhance distribution networks.

Homa Bay County stands out as the most improved county in this sector, having made significant strides in increasing waterfront coverage by expanding piped water systems. This pivotal development not only signifies progress in providing safe water access but also underscores the county's commitment to sustainable water management.

In conclusion, Kenya's journey towards equitable access to clean and safe water is marked by the commitment and innovative approaches taken by various counties. These initiatives, ranging from infrastructure development to technology-driven solutions, signify the collective effort to safeguard this invaluable resource and promote the well-being of the Kenyan population.



Additionally, they have spearheaded the development of community-based forest management plans, invested in water infrastructure enhancements, and championed sustainable agriculture through organic farming practices, reduced reliance on chemical pesticides, and responsible waste disposal. By prioritizing soil health and cultivating a culture of eco-friendly agriculture, these counties are leading the way towards a more sustainable future.

The top-performing county, Uasin Gishu, has focused on re-afforestation through tree planting programs. They have also ensured the conservation of various water sources, such as rivers Sosiani and Kipkaren, the Chebara dam, and Kaptagat forest. Another top performer, Elgeyo Marakwet, has equally initiated tree-planting programs to mitigate soil erosion around various water bodies.

Other top-performing counties are Embu, Nyeri, Kericho, Tharaka Nithi, and Trans Nzoia.

The most improved county, Homabay, has embarked on community-based deforestation efforts, promotion of improved cooking stoves, and sustainable agriculture, among other things.

Other most improved counties in 2023 are Trans Nzoia, Embu, Mandera, and Kisii.







The most improved county in Culture and Sports was Trans Nzoia. Other improved counties are Homa Bay, Embu, Samburu, and Kiambu.



Social services programs have emerged as integral contributors to the success of numerous Kenyan counties, with a focus on addressing essential social needs, promoting inclusivity, and enhancing the well-being of residents.

These initiatives cater to various vulnerable groups like the elderly, youth, and persons living with disabilities (PLWDs) through healthcare services, social engagement activities, and economic empowerment aimed at fostering economic sustainability and dignified life. The child protection and welfare programs are geared towards creating safe environments for vulnerable children. At the same time, the gender equality and women empowerment projects aim to uplift women's status in society, reduce gender-based violence, and promote their active participation in decision-making processes.

The top two performing counties in social service, Elgeyo Marakwet and Trans Nzoia have introduced programs in collaboration with partners and the community to cater to the elderly and vulnerable children, respectively. They have also introduced tailor made empowerment programmes to elevate the livelihoods of other vulnerable groups.

Other top-performing counties are Bomet, Makueni, West Pokot, Tharaka Nithi, Murang'a, Kericho, and Turkana.

Trans Nzoia, Tharaka Nithi, Murang'a, Bomet, Kirinyaga, and Homa Bay were the most improved counties in social services.



Devolution is not just about decentralizing authority; it is a promise of participatory governance that empowers communities to shape their own destinies. In this transformative context, planning emerges as the bridge that connects the aspirations of the people with the strategic priorities of county governments. It is the instrument through which the collective voice of citizens is translated into actionable policies, programs, and projects through County Integrated Development Plans (CIDPs) and annual budgets, which are not just bureaucratic documents but living documents that reflect the dreams, needs, and goals of the people they serve.

The top performing county in planning, Trans Nzoia, has, in the first year of the new administration, launched a comprehensive and ambitious CIDP program that was apparently informed by public participation.

Other top-performing counties like Uasin Gishu, Kirinyaga, Murang'a, West Pokot, Nyeri, Embu, Turkana, and Kwale have equally inaugurated their CIDPs through a seemingly inclusive and participatory process.

The most improved county is Trans Nzoia. Other improved counties include Homa Bay, Kiambu, Samburu, Murang'a, and Kirinyaga, which have also implemented "bottom-up approaches "to their planning function.



Public Participation is a critical linchpin that holds together the pillars of transparency, accountability, and inclusivity within robust democracies. It must never be a mere gesture rather, it must act as the lifeblood that breathes vitality into governance processes and ensures that the voice of every citizen is not only heard but also heeded.

The 2010 constitution envisioned a system where all county governments would engrain all citizens as integral players in the decision-making process. With a seat on the table where sharing of their perspectives, concerns, and aspirations was facilitated, devolution would truly come to life.

Different counties have used various forms of public participation over the years. These include community meetings and consultations, feedback mechanisms, online platforms, and grassroots involvement in county planning and budgeting processes.

The top-performing county, Elgeyo Marakwet, has incorporated policies and laws to guide equitable governance. They have also instituted various forums to enable stakeholders to engage with the government. Other leading counties are West Pokot and Homabay, which have engrained similar initiatives.

The most improved county is Embu, followed by Homa Bay, Kisii, Kiambu, and Mombasa.






