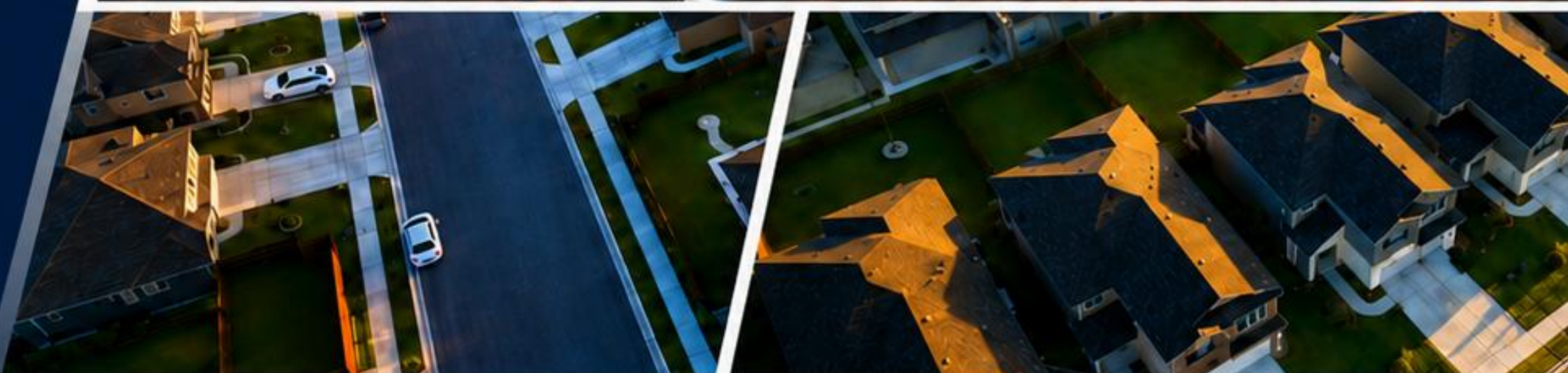

For more than two decades, Infotrak has listened to Kenyans speak about leadership, governance, public service and the quality of representation they receive from those elected to serve them. The Infotrak Elected Leaders Performance Rating is part of that commitment.

These ratings are not about political flattery. They are not about punishment either. They are about citizen judgement.

Every elected leader carries a constitutional mandate. But beyond legal text, leadership is also experienced in daily life. Citizens know whether a leader is accessible, whether promises are followed by action, whether public resources appear to be used responsibly, and whether their community feels seen, heard and represented. That lived experience matters.

This 11th edition captures the voices of 87,286 Kenyans. The final scores reflect the average ratings given by citizens in each leader's constituency or county.

Infotrak did not rate the leaders, citizens did.

And every mirror asks:

What will you do with what you now see?

Over the years, this rating has been welcomed, debated, challenged and, at times, resisted. That is not surprising. Accountability is rarely comfortable, especially when it is public. Scrutiny of our work is legitimate and welcome. Misrepresentation, however, must be answered with clarity.

To be clear, this rating is not a paid endorsement. It is not a negotiated score. It is not an elite judgement imposed on citizens. Scores cannot be bought, adjusted or negotiated.

The integrity of this exercise rests on a simple principle: public opinion, when professionally collected and transparently reported, is a democratic resource. A high score is not a crown. A low score is not a sentence. It is feedback.

These numbers do more than list top performers. They ask what the citizen experience of elected leadership reveals about representation in Kenya today. Kenyans observe, compare and remember. They reward visibility, responsiveness, accountability and delivery. They also revise their judgement when leaders miss the mark.

DEMOCRATIC ACCOUNTABILITY

Elections let citizens choose leaders. Accountability continues between elections as citizens observe, assess and judge whether leaders are present, responsive and responsible in public life.

WHAT THE RATING MEASURES

The Infotrak Elected Leaders Performance Rating captures citizen judgement – it does not manufacture public opinion. Respondents rated their Members of Parliament, Senators and Women Representatives on a 1–10 scale, where 1 = very poor and 10 = excellent. Scores shown are average citizen ratings in each leader’s constituency or county.

WHAT IT DOES NOT MEASURE

This is not a weighted index. It does not audit expenditure, parliamentary attendance, legislative output, committee work or CDF use. It captures citizens’ perception of leaders’ performance.

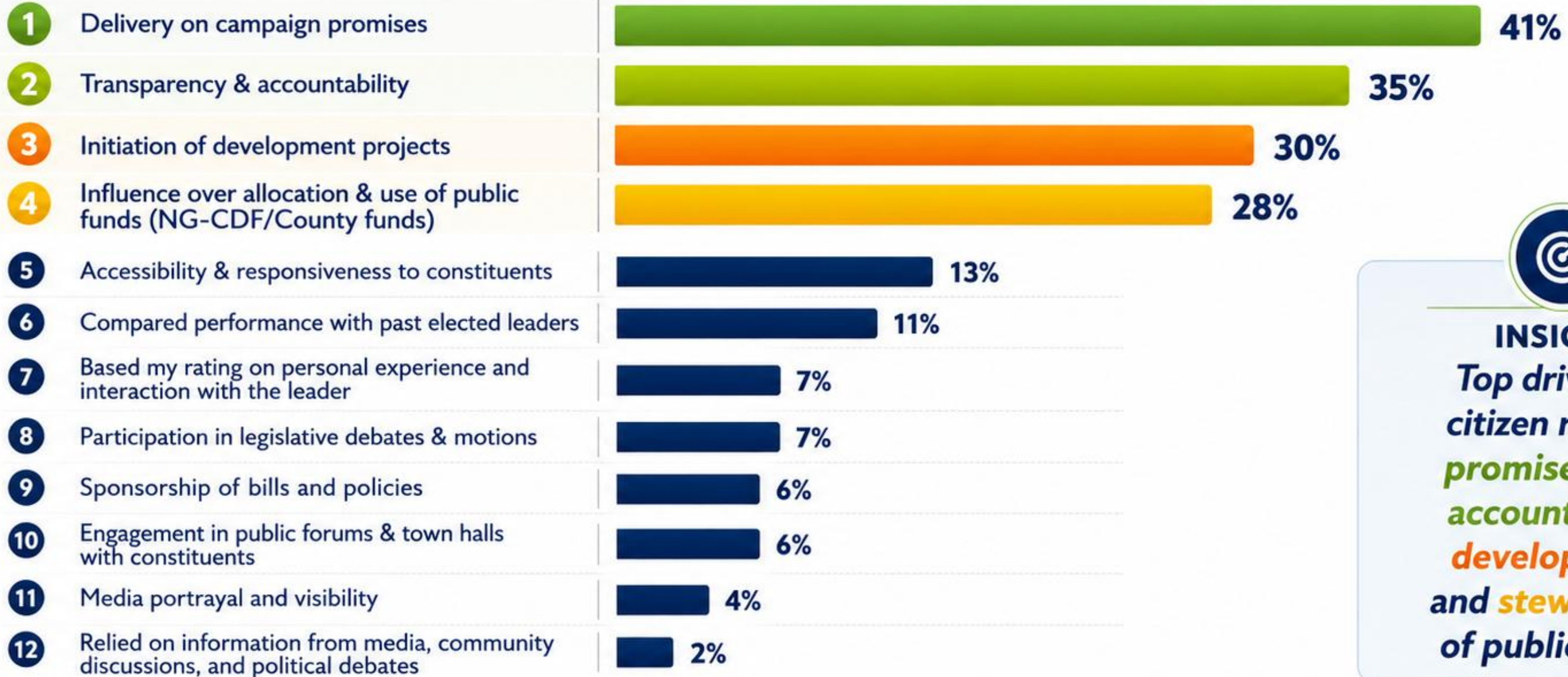

Reading each office on its own terms

The 2026 Infotrak Elected Leaders Performance Rating shows how Kenyans rate Members of Parliament, Senators and Women Representatives on their performance. It reflects public confidence, not election outcomes.

2026 ratings have improved from 2024, though recovery is uneven. MPs lead the way, Senators are steady, while Women Representatives continue to face visibility challenges.

The ratings do not predict elections. They measure how citizens perceive performance today.

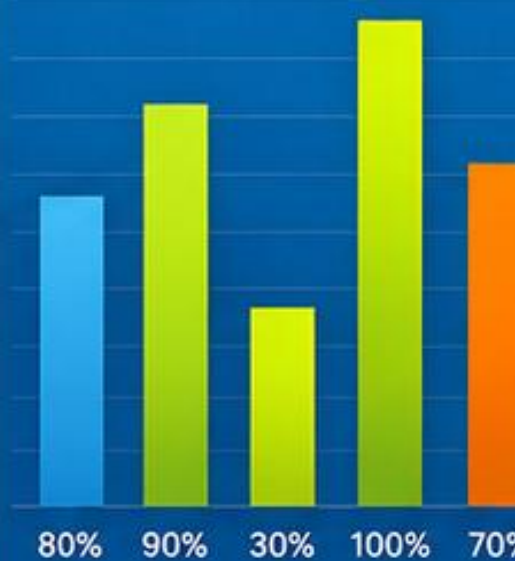
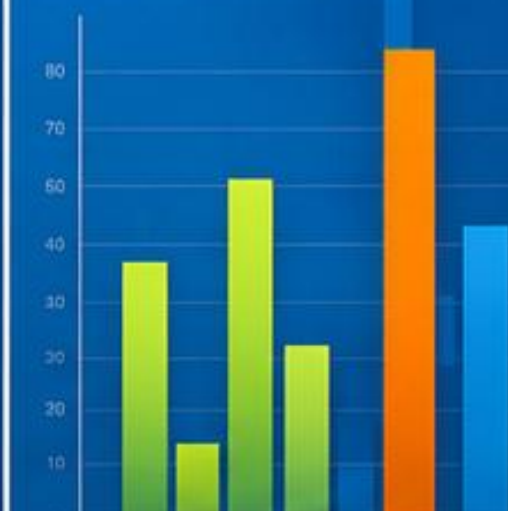


High ratings may indicate goodwill and stronger citizen relationships. Low ratings may point to concerns that need attention.

WOMEN REPRESENTATIVES



THE WOMEN REPRESENTATIVE QUESTION

Mandate, Visibility and Recognition



Women Representatives face a different public expectation challenge.

Their constitutional and political role centres on representation, advocacy and inclusion, particularly for women, youth, persons with disabilities and other vulnerable groups. These functions are important, but they are not always as physically visible as roads, classrooms, bursaries or local infrastructure.

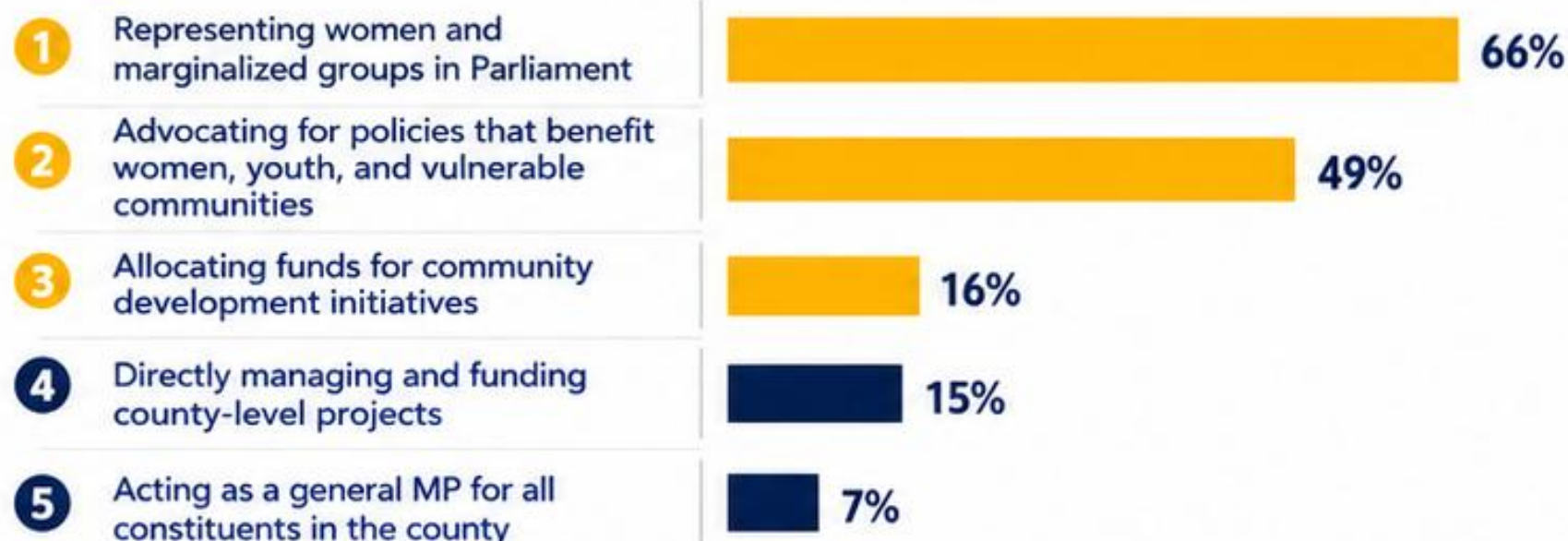


They often have to work harder to make their mandate visible, understood and valued.

Lower public ratings should be read carefully: they may reflect performance concerns, but they may also reflect a wider public communication challenge around the role itself.

KEY TAKEAWAY

Women Representatives are judged in a difficult expectation environment. Citizens most strongly associate the office with representation and advocacy, yet lower ratings are driven largely by role ambiguity, limited awareness of achievements, and lower visibility of impact.

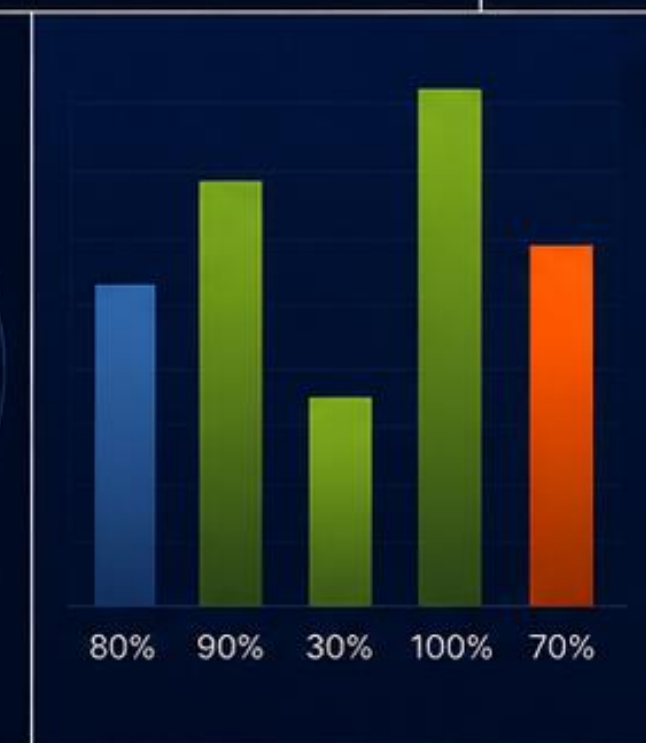
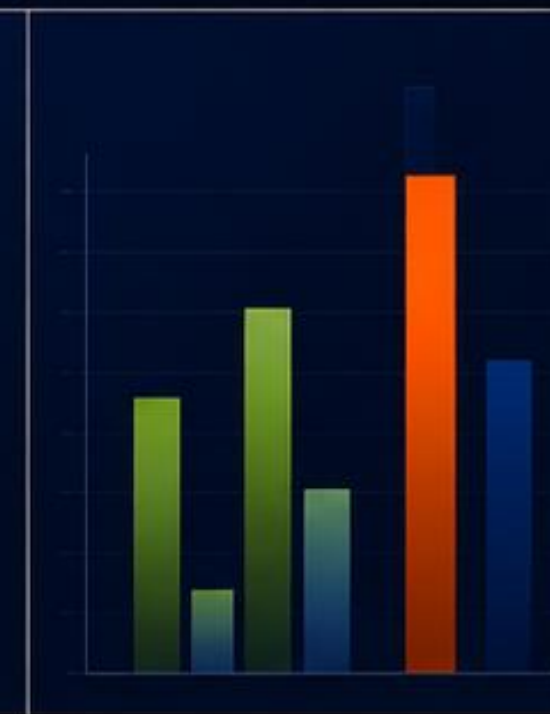
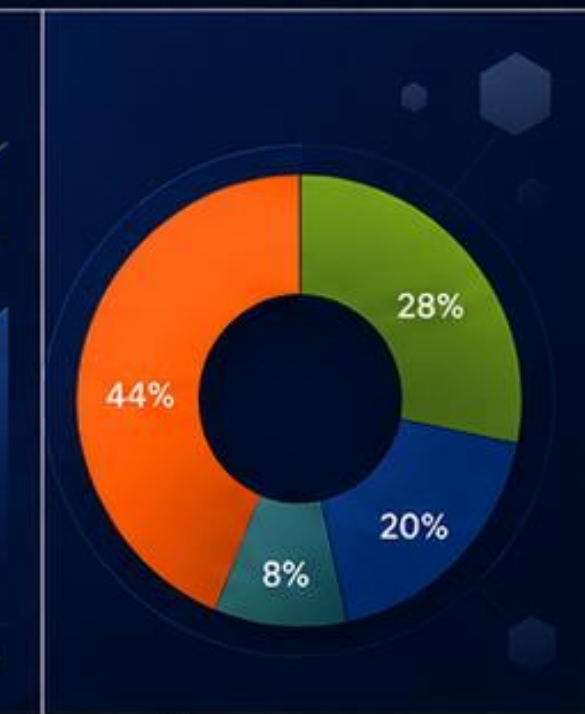

THE SENATOR QUESTION: NATIONAL PLATFORM, COUNTY EXPECTATION

“ Why the role is less visible

Senators operate in a space that is often less visible to ordinary citizens. Their mandate includes representing counties, protecting devolution, legislating and overseeing county interests. Much of this work happens in Parliament, committees, national debate and institutional oversight.

”

What citizens still ask

Citizens nonetheless ask a practical question: is the Senator visible in defending the county's interests? A Senator may be active nationally, but if citizens do not connect that activity to county benefit, the rating may not fully reflect institutional effort. Communication, presence and translation of Senate work into county-level relevance therefore matter.
